



## Black Project Fins / Mistral '14

*This guide outlines some suggested fin set ups for the most popular Mistral windsurfing boards for 2014. This guide has been designed for most riders; advanced or lighter riders are likely to choose one size smaller. There is no substitute for testing yourself and you are encouraged to find the perfect balance for your particular set of circumstances, our dealers will help you with this. 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### Slalom



The Type R and Type RS fins will help to tune your Mistral Slalom board into a race-winning machine. Heavier riders or those who sail with lots of back foot pressure should choose the Type R for more drive and grip. For riders concentrating on pure downwind slalom (or speed) the Type RS has a looser feel and has a higher top end speed. Riders sailing close to the wind and/or on a figure-8 course should choose the Type R.

### Speed



The Black Project Fins Type S and Type X fins are ideally suited to help you get the maximum performance from your Mistral Speed board. We work closely with Mistral and Black Project team rider *Jurjen van der Noord* to ensure that our fins complement the Mistral Speed range perfectly. The Type S will be preferable and faster on choppy and tighter courses while for unmatched ultimate speed, choose the asymmetric Type X when the course flattens out and broadens. Remember to choose either Port or Starboard tack for your asymmetric fins.

## Screamer



The iconic Screamer will be transformed when you adjust the fin to balance with the combination of factors you face. Many Screamer riders will be looking for a one-board quiver and by utilizing a selection of fins riders can adjust the ride and feel of the board to ensure that they are perfectly balanced in a range of conditions with a range of sails and sail sizes. The Type R can be used to increase speed and drive, this is ideal if you are using big and/or cambered sails and are looking to get maximum performance and range with your freeride board. For riders looking to soften their ride slightly and increase ease of use and jibing then the Freeride fin is an excellent choice, which will promote both speed and control.
